College Lake Wildlife Garden Volunteer

Based at location

College Lake, Upper Icknield Way, Bulbourne, Tring, Herts, HP23 5QG

Purpose of the role

This role is part of a volunteer gardening team maintaining and developing our wildlife garden, orchard and containers. The garden has been designed to be a demonstration to the public of ways in which they can invite wildlife into their gardens at home.

You will work closely with the learning team who use the garden to deliver activities, and the reserves volunteers who maintain the wider nature reserve. There may be opportunities to get involved both with delivering learning activities and with work on the wider reserve if desired.

There are areas for pollinator-friendly flower-planting, bushes, trees and wildflowers, a wildflower meadow area, wildlife pond, composting area and woodland glade and hedges. Outside of the Wildlife Garden, we have a container garden area and an orchard which is managed for wildlife and fruit production. The team also look after planters outside of our café, in which we use edible plants to create an attractive display.

We are aiming to propagate more of our own plants from seed, cuttings and division. The plants could then be used for the garden plus selling plants in our shop.

Type of work in which you will be involved

Undertaking varied garden and orchard management tasks, including:

- Propagating plants from seed, division, cuttings and grafts; growing and caring for plants,
- Bed maintenance and watering
- Hedge maintenance
- Pond maintenance
- Wildflower meadow maintenance
- Orchard pruning and grass management and improvement
- There are also opportunities to be involved in visitor engagement roles such as garden open days or orchard events.





Experience and skills required

No experience necessary, but enthusiasm and patience are important. If you have gardening, orchard or horticultural knowledge that is always useful, but a reasonable level of fitness and enthusiasm for being outdoors and working on gardening projects is as important.

Must be a good team player but also able to work unsupervised and have a willingness to learn about and practice wildlife friendly gardening and orchard management methods.
