Purpose of the role

To assist the learning team in engaging and teaching young people about British wildlife and nature conservation by helping to deliver educational sessions with school groups, Wildlife Clubs; Nature Tots, Rangers, Uniform groups e.g. Scouts and family events.

Type of work in which you will be involved

- Setting up and setting down equipment needed for the various sessions.
- Assist in the delivery of nature-based educational sessions across our many audiences mentioned above. This will involve working with children, families, school staff/parents, uniform group leaders and general visitors.
- Preparing materials / resources for sessions under the guidance of the Learning Team
- Assist in ensuring health and safety obligations are met including reading and implementing on the day risk assessments and reporting any hazards.
- Undertake training and attend meetings as required.
- Promoting the work of BBOWT and activity opportunities.

- Working or volunteering with nursery/primary-aged children is advantageous.
- Delivering activities and sessions both formal and informal is advantageous.

- An understanding of health and safety and safeguarding requirements in relation to children.
- Ability to work outdoors in all weathers and confidently manoeuvre on uneven, rough terrain.

- Able to act independently and as part of a team.
- Willingness to show flexibility and resourcefulness.
